

Three years in...

What a difference three years make. I arrived on site July 8th, 2020. In the heart of the pandemic, nothing was normal. No visitors were allowed on the reservation; we had not had a group in months, and no idea when we would be able to host groups again. Kid's Time was delivering activity packages and snacks. The Job Corp had just come back to work we had just started handing out sandwiches. Following COVID guidelines we did our best to keep people safe.

A lot has changed in the last 3 years. Groups have returned. We love having the visitors. As I write this we have 13 people in the for an immersion. **Tony Walking** has been hired in part to be the Immersion Director. (More on Tony on page 4).

The newest program is the Homeless shelter. In partnership with Iglutheca we are providing a safe warm place for people to get their lives together. Funding for the shelter came from an housing grant with the State of South Dakota and the ELCA. (See page 5 for more information.)

Henry Brown is now the Director of Youth and Family. He and his staff work with 75-80 kids per week and the older kid program is off to a great start. (See below for more details.)

We have remodeled the center and adapted to our new reality. We even built a new sleeping room.

The energy program was busier then ever last season and the requests are already coming in for this winter. (Page 2 for more information.)


We have an Intern!!! —Lessanes Goings!






An immersion group learning the White Buffalo Woman.

Pine Ridge Reservation

The Pine Ridge Indian Reservation, also called Pine Ridge Agency, is the Oglala Lakota Indian reservation located in South Dakota. It consists of 3,468.85 sq mi of land area and is one of the largest reservations in the United States. Pine Ridge is the site of several events that mark milestones in the history between the Sioux and the United States.

Located at the southern end of the Badlands, the reservation is part of the mixed grass prairie, part of the Great Plains.
